Some people call Ibague the "Music Capital of Colombia". It is nestled in the Andes Mountains and surrounded with a 360 degree view of lush vegetation. But, as always, the most beautiful attraction in Ibague were the people. We met and worked with some of the nicest, most loving people. The pastors and their families were gracious hosts to us. Their love and appreciation for the team was very gratifying. The pastors told us that there had never been a conference such as ours that they could remember in their city. However, our visit to Ibague was not received well by everyone. Many of the pastors in the city were unwilling to work with one another and held services of their own to prevent their congregations from attending our pastor's conference and crusade. This situation is not

unfamiliar to us. Often when we enter into a city or village for the first time we experience this conflict. Our ministry has proven over time to bring unity and reconciliation between rival churches. When the pastors learn that we come to teach and encourage the leaders by demonstrating love and a servant-leader's heart, we are welcomed back with open arms. Every time we hold a pastor's conference we are always invited to come back and new doors of opportunities are open to us. Just after being in Nicaragua and Colombia this year, we have received invitations to go to Ecuador, Venezuela and the Amazon. The opportunities are limitless since the nation shares borders with Panama, Venezuela, Brazil, Peru and Ecuador, and maritime limits with Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Honduras, Jamaica, Dominican Republic and Haiti.

Our team had just finished the last night of ministry when this young pastor came to me and said "*Your ministry has changed my life forever. I was going to quit the ministry, but now I can go on.*" His Thank You really goes Out to you!
