For the first couple of years they only ate vegetables because meat was too expensive. Yatislov built their church by providing free rides to people waiting on the metro station. He said that in the winter passengers were especially grateful for the warmth of his car and were receptive to the Gospel. Now the city is safe and filled with hope. We will be with Pastor Yatislov again December and are believing for a mighty move of God's Spirit.
